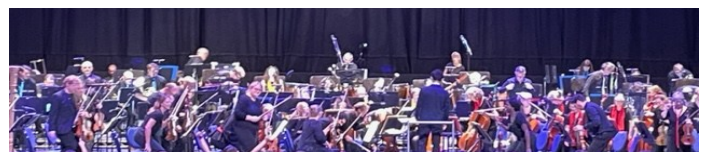
KS2 Eyam Trip

Uniform Policy

Review every two years

Regular Uniform

- White polo shirt
- Royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan
- Dark grey tailored skirt, pinafore (knee length) or tailored trousers – not tracksuit bottoms, cargo style or jeans
- Dark grey socks/tights
- Black school shoes (not trainers)
- Navy blue fleece (optional)
- Royal blue sunhat, legionnaires or baseball cap

Summer Uniform – optional

- Dark grey tailored school shorts (not sport shorts or cargo style) may be worn with white polo shirts and dark grey ankle socks
- Blue gingham checked summer dresses (not jumpsuit style) with plain white socks

PE

- Black shorts
- White T-Shirt (logo preferred)
- Plimsolls
- Trainers
- Spare pair of socks
- Plain, black tracksuit bottoms
- Plain, black warm hoodie/sweatshirt

Amendments & Considerations

Governors and the Headteacher will consider any requests from parents/carers for individual children to have adjustments made to school uniform for medical or committed religious reasons.

Croc and Ugg style shoes/boots/sandals are not permitted to be worn inside school.

Embroidered school sweatshirts and polo shirts can be purchased through our school representative (details available via the school office), or you may decide to source your uniform elsewhere.

Jewellery

On health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule: one small stud in each ear and watches. Watches should be a sensible size and should not distract either the child or other pupils. No watches or devices that connect to the internet are permitted. Watches and earrings must be removed for all PE. If you are having your child's ears pierced, we suggest you arrange this for the beginning of the summer holidays, so the ear is healed and the earring ready to be removed for PE sessions at school in the Autumn Term. Nail polish is not permitted to be worn.

Hair

For reasons of safety and personal hygiene, hair that touches the shoulders should be tied back with plain dark-coloured hair accessories. Hair may be tied back using blue gingham hair scrunchies, if the child is wearing the summer blue gingham dress option. The school does not permit children to wear hair gel or to have 'extreme' haircuts or colours.

Inappropriate uniform

- In the event of a child or children not adhering to the different aspects of the school uniform policy:
- First, a standard letter will be issued to the appropriate parent.
- Secondly, the school will provide the pupil with suitable clothing to wear whilst on school premises where appropriate in order to provide time for parents to purchase the necessary uniform.
- Thirdly, children will not be allowed to participate in certain extra-curricular activities including educational visits and lunchtime clubs until they are in full compliance with the uniform policy - this includes 'extreme' haircuts or colours.
- Parents will be given one week to ensure compliance with the uniform policy, failing which the Headteacher may
